Today (Wednesday 5 October 2022), the **Association of British Orchestras** (ABO) is delighted to announce the new participants selected to take part in its International Mentoring Programme for emerging orchestra leaders for 2022-23, in close partnership with the British Council.

These ambitious individuals have been paired with senior figures from the UK orchestral sector to mentor them, supporting the development of their knowledge and expertise, and to enable the creation of new links between international peers.

The International Mentoring Scheme, delivered by the ABO with the support of the British Council, is designed to benefit the next generation of emerging leaders of orchestras. It offers participants the opportunity to create international networks for the future and learn more about working with the UK.

Throughout the nine-month programme, starting in July 2022, participants will receive 1:1 mentoring conversations with their UK mentors and opportunities to network. Participants will also the <u>ABO Annual Conference</u> on 1-3 February 2023, in Leeds and then have the opportunity to stay on for a further 5 days to spend time with their mentor's organisation.

Now in its second year, the programme follows the success of the 2021-22 International Mentoring Programme and continues to be guided by the ABO's Education consultant Fiona Harvey, in collaboration with the British Council.
