## UK orchestras to champion 11 of the best pieces of British orchestral music from the past 25 years through PRS Foundation's Resonate programme.

- Orchestras supported include Ulster Orchestra, London Philharmonic Orchestra, Chineke! Orchestra and Royal Northern Sinfonia
- Pieces selected include Thomas Ades' 'In Seven Days', Judith Weir's 'Winter Song' and Gavin Higgins 'Velocity'

PRS Foundation, the UK's leading funder of new music and talent development across all genres announces today, the 11 UK orchestras being supported through **Resonate**, a partnership with the Association of British Orchestras and BBC Radio 3, which champions outstanding pieces of British orchestral music from the past 25 years and aims to inspire more performances, recordings and broadcasts of these works.

The orchestras and **Resonate** pieces to be programmed into their upcoming 2017/18 programmes are:

- Royal Northern Sinfonia: James MacMillan, St Luke Passion
- Royal Scottish National Orchestra: Gavin Higgins, Velocity
- Southbank Sinfonia: Judith Weir, Winter Song
- Ulster Orchestra: David Matthews, Symphony no.8

Resonate is a new fund and resource which aims to inspire more performances, recordings and broadcasts of outstanding contemporary repertoire, as chosen by UK orchestras.

The Resonate database has been created to demonstrate the scope and quality of new music already commissioned by UK orchestras and to encourage orchestras to revisit pieces which would strengthen their programming of contemporary repertoire. The long-term goal of Resonate is to establish a recognised body of works and increase players' and audiences' familiarity with the music of the UK's most talented composers.

**Vanessa Reed, Chief Executive, PRS Foundation** said, "*This list gives us a taste of the many excellent, and often substantial, contemporary orchestral pieces which have not received the exposure they deserve. I hope the Resonate database and the success of these performances next year will inspire other orchestras to broaden their relationship with composers by demonstrating that compelling programmes of existing work are as important as new commissions.*"
